utdoor spaces play a vital role in our lives, providing a connection to nature and a sanctuary from the hustle and bustle of our day-to-day life. Outdoor living spaces are opportunities for introducing open fire and flowing water, creating whimsy, and introducing sounds that differ significantly from the emotions experienced inside the home.

Whether it's a small patio, a spacious terrace, or a multistructure estate, designing beautiful and functional outdoor living spaces requires creativity and careful planning to create functional, comfortable, and beautiful environments that seamlessly blend with their natural surroundings. Blend Indoor & Outdoor Living

Shade & Shelter

Structures such as pergolas, gazebos, pavilions, and pool houses provide shade and shelter and create a gathering and entertaining destination away from the main house. For example, in addition to meeting functional requirements, today's pool houses often offer both indoor and outdoor lounge spaces with stone fireplaces, conditioned spaces with foldaway glass walls creating the ability for year-round use, full kitchen and dining spaces accommodating everything from lunch for the kids to full farm-to-table meals, built-in gourmet grilling centers with entertaining features such as pizza ovens and ceramic smokers, outdoor fire pits, and full-scale bar spaces taking the form of anything from a rustic barn to a modern sports bar aesthetic.

To create a truly experiential space for friends and family to gather, some pool houses are also designed to accommodate pool tables





or ping pong tables, home gyms, and guest suites, and can also be supported by a bocce ball court, croquet court, pickleball court, or playground space.

The choice of materials used in these accessory structures can significantly influence the character and aesthetic of the outdoor area. For instance, a wooden pergola seamlessly blends into nature, natural stone creates a timeless and rustic ambiance, and sleek metal elements convey a more contemporary feel.

Furniture Selection
